At the November meeting, Mr. Tanner's paper on "Building Materials used by the Post Office Engineering Department" dealt with a phase of departmental work which had hitherto not been brought before the notice of the local members of the institution, and proved helpful, whilst Mr. Pickering's paper on "Devolution and its Effects," in December, cleared up many points.

Mr. Wolstenholme was to have been the lecturer at the January meeting, but, as he had obtained a commission in the Durham Light Infantry, Mr. Ray, of Carlisle, took his place, and delivered a paper on "Notes on Aërial Construction," which was illustrated by means of lantern slides, showing many difficult jobs which had come under his notice.

In February a special meeting was held so that the members of the institution might have the opportunity of hearing Mr. Renshaw deliver his paper on the "Ethics of Supervision," and all who have read that paper in the last number of the Journal will readily understand that a lively discussion followed, which enabled the members to state fully their opinions, and it was interesting to note the different ideas of the essentials of supervision held by the members.

The attendance throughout the session has been well maintained.

### ON ACTIVE SERVICE.

The members of the North-Eastern District are proud of one of their colleagues—Sergeant Tucker—whose conduct at Kleinzonne-beke was briefly referred to in the 'Post Office Circular' of the 9th February. The feat which Tucker performed, and for which he has been granted the Distinguished Conduct Medal, is all the more meritorious when the full circumstances are known. It was not carried out at a time when "a wild, mad rush" was being made, but when, with the knowledge of his senior officer's wishes, the predicament the whole of his company was placed in, and the quick decision made in the interests of his comrades, that Tucker coolly carried out his dangerous task.

\* \* \*

A company of the 2nd King's Royal Rifles—Tucker was a private—occupied a trench at Kleinzonnebeke opposite a German trench, separated by fifty yards. The Germans placed a machine gun in position, and in a few minutes the company of the 2nd King's Royal Rifles would have been at the mercy of the Germans if the gun had not been put out of action. Tucker was asked by his lieutenant if he would volunteer to put the gun out of action, and although, as he modestly states, the job was not to his liking, he picked up a trenching tool, went into the open, and, covered by his

comrades' rifles, knocked the emplacement from under the gun and returned. His chagrin may readily be imagined when, on his return, he learned that the lieutenant was not satisfied with the work done, and that it was considered that the gun was as great a menace as ever! A second time he crossed the fifty yards, and, making certain of his work, caused the gun to roll over, so that it could not be replaced by the Germans without exposing themselves to the fire of the 2nd King's Royal Rifles. Tucker returned safely.

He was promoted a corporal, then a sergeant, and is now—a hero.

Since the incident described above, Tucker was blown out of a trench at La Bassee on New Year's Day, and, as a result, has been suffering from nervous shock, but it is pleasing to record that he is recovering.

### SCOTLAND WEST CENTRE.

The first meeting of the session was held on January 15th, 1915, when a paper was read by Mr. A. Jacquest on "Testing and Balancing of Underground Cables which are required for Superimposed Telephone Working."

#### INSTITUTION

The lecturer gave a short description of the theory underlying the tests, and then described, in more detail, the actual operations which are carried out in order to balance, so far as possible, at each selected joint. The actual apparatus which is being used on the Glasgow Paisley and Glasgow Edinburgh cables was on view, and the practical arrangements described. A short description was also given of the tests for differential resistance and cross talk.

The local branch are much indebted to Mr. Jacquest for kindly preparing lantern slides and giving his paper and a practical

demonstration of the work involved in this new branch of cable balancing.

Corporal W. J. Northcote, Cable Company, Royal Engineers (Territorials), a skilled workman from Glasgow Post Office, has been awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal for repairing a telegraph line on November 21st under shell fire lafter it had been destroyed by German shells. Two of the Worcesters were killed and three wounded in proximity to the line. Corporal Northcote has done continued good work since he went to the front, and, it is claimed, is the first Territorial to receive the D.C.M. For that reason his comrades at the front are proud of him, as letters to friends in Glasgow testify, and we are sure all at home will heartily agree with the sentiment.

The opportunity is also taken of thanking Mr. A. S. Renshaw for reading his paper on the "Ethics of Supervision" during his visit to this district. A profitable discussion followed the reading of the paper, and Mr. Renshaw is to be congratulated on the manner in which he placed the ethical views of supervision before his hearers.

Mr. C. E. Pollock and Mr. R. D. S. Norman, both members of the local centre, have been given commissions as second licutenants in the Signal Section of the Royal Engineers. Both of these gentlemen served through the Boer War. Lieut. Norman has been serving in one of the signalling units at Aldershot since October, and has only recently received his promotion. Lieut. Pollock, who left the district at the beginning of February, is now on active service with a signalling unit.

### BOOK REVIEWS.

'Automatic Telephony: A Comprehensive Treatise on Automatic and Semi-Automatic Systems,' by Arthur Bessey Smith, E.E., and Wilson Lee Campbell, E.E. (The McGraw-Hill Book Coy., 6, Bouverie Street., London, E.C. 173.)

In the early days of the development of automatic telephony in the United States, practically the only printed information available on the subject, on this side of the Atlantic, was contained in certain pamphlets bearing the names of the writers of the above volume. Prior to 1908, the installation of automatic telephone equipment was almost entirely carried out by the "independent" companies, and while it was in the interests of these companies that the claims of the automatic systems to superiority should be bruited abroad, it did not follow that the publication of detailed descriptions of the mechanisms and circuits would be to their advantage. In these latter days, however, the literature on the subject has grown apace, and, incidentally, it is not claiming too much to say that this JOURNAL has done more than any other periodical to spread the knowledge of the various systems. The articles by Messrs. W. J. Bailey, R. Lawsom J. Hedley, and others, which have appeared in our pages, have been widely read throughout the world, and from all parts appreciatory notices have been received.

Our descriptions have, however, appeared at intervals, as the British Post Office installed the exchanges, and the necessity had arisen for a text-book on the subject which would combine within its covers a comprehensive study of the systems as they are now in operation, so that the telephone engineer may compare readily the methods and efficiencies of the several plants. Such a text-book is now before us. The authors have done their work in an exhaustive fashion. Detailed descriptions are given of the Automatic Electric Company's switchboard apparatus and system, of the American Automatic Telephone Company's plant, the Siemens and Halske system, the Lorimer, the Clement automatic systems. Chapters are also devoted to traffic distribution schemes, power plant, traffic and development studies.

The plates and diagrams are clear, and the printing and binding are of the best quality. The volume is one that every telephone expert should have at hand, if he wishes to keep in touch with the extraordinary development which has taken place in machine switching in the last half-dozen years.

'The Universal Electrical Directory' (J. A. Berly's), 1915. (Messrs. Alabaster, Gatehouse and Co., 4, Ludgate Hill, E.C.)

The importance of the electrical industry is illustrated in a very marked fashion by the fact that in this year's edition of the above there are no fewer than 35,390 names of firms engaged in the manufacture or distribution of electrical material.

In spite of its bulk, however, there is no confusion in the compilation, the sections being subdivided into alphabetical and classified parts, a thumb index indicating where each section may be found. Telegraphic addresses, telephone numbers, and financial particulars of limited liability companies are given, and in the list of supply undertakings full particulars of the capacity and character of the plant are quoted. In the British Section a list of specialities appears, together with the necessary information as to where they can be obtained. The edition maintains its character for accuracy, and should be invaluable to the electrical trade generally. Price £1 1s. od., post free; the "A" edition, which omits the Continental and U.S.A. sections, 12s. od., also post free.

#### C.T.O. SECTION.

The original right inch Creed air-pressure main has now been replaced by one of 2½ inch bore. The new main has been run from the container in the basement to the first, second, and third floors; and already the majority of the seventeen outlets provided have been allocated to Creed sets.

St. James' Street B.O.—A set of house tubes has been installed in this office and, being of brass, are of an ornamental character. The motor-pump has been fitted in a cellar away from the main building, and all noise and vibration in the office has thereby been avoided.

Hatton Garden B.O.—The above office was removed recently, and this involved cutting the existing street tube in Hatton Garden and extending it to the new office. The office fittings were installed well in advance of the date of removal, and a stoppage of only a few hours was involved, in order to make the actual cross-connection in the street.

Ludgate Circus B.O. - The street tubes have been removed to a new position in this office, and a local tube, with power obtained from one of the street tubes, has been installed; the necessity for a hand pump has thereby been avoided.

Staff Notes.—It was very pleasant to observe the almost affectionate farewell which was accorded, by the telegraphists of the News Division, to Mr. R. M. Spratley on his retirement. Mr. Spratley was a mechanic who, for a generation at least, had charge of the T.S. pneumatic perforators, and faithfully fulfilled his duty.—The promotion of Foremen Mechanics Liston and Dykes, of the Central Telegraph Office Workshops, to the rank of Inspector, is worthy of note as indicating the trend of modern telegraphy in the direction of automatic machinery.

Typewriting telegraphy bids fair to bring about the supersession of skilled telegraphists by skilled mechanics.

the flow of current in a three-phase circuit being included. This chapter also contains a clear and well-illustrated description of a wattmeter, and a discussion of the methods of measuring power in polyphase circuits.

In the chapter on alternations there is a good description of the different types to be met with, their general construction and windings and methods of synchronising, including a description of the " synchronoscope."

Chapter V opens with the subject of choking coils, and gives as a practical example a complete description of a "dimming switch" for electric light. The different methods of construction and transformers, the types met with, their advantages and disadvantages, and methods of testing are fully discussed.

The final chapter treats of alternating current motors, including synchronous motors, induction motors, and single phase commutator motors. A simple explanation of the working of each type is given, together with a discussion of their characteristics and spheres of usefulness. The method of constructing the "circle diagram" for induction motors is stated, and the different methods of starting explained. A very useful collection of City and Guilds and A.M.I.E.E. questions is provided at the end of each chapter, answers being given for all numerical questions. An index of formulæ and a resumé of the vector diagrams contained in the book are somewhat novel features.

The book is well written, well illustrated, and well printed, and as a preliminary introduction to the study of alternating currents is thought to be unequalled.

### BREAKDOWN IN THE MIDLANDS.

Up to the end of May, 265 members of the Staff had been with-drawn for temporary work in the Midlands to assist in repairing damage caused by the blizzard of March 28th and 29th.

### CENTRAL TELEGRAPH OFFICE SECTION.

Street Tubes.—The re-arrangement of the street tube-terminals within the Central Telegraph Office has been completed, and also the substitution of modern pneumatic switches for the old double sluice valves. The work has taken two or three years, but progress was necessarily slow as no tube could be stopped for more than a few hours at a time, and, in many cases, temporary shifts had to be made to enable the final sites to be prepared for the new switches. A very great improvement in the working of the tubes has resulted.

Owing to the war, female operators will be employed, and, so far as they have been tried, they apppear to have had little or no

difficulty in coping with the work.

The pressure of work on one of the tubes has been so great that batches of carriers have had to be sent, and a 20 seconds timing signal has been installed to enable carriers to be inserted at regular intervals. Blockages have thereby been avoided, although ordinary signals are used only at the beginning and end of each batch.

House Tubes at Post Offices.—In spite of the war these laboursaving devices are in frequent demand, and improvements in signall-

ing are being tried.

Telegraph Apparatus.—The more complicated modern telegraph apparatus is still in demand. Six typewriter perforators have displaced a similar number of pneumatic perforators in the News Division, and Baudots and Creeds continue to be installed.

On p. 72 the author uses the words "induced" and "produced" in reference to the magnetic field from a current in a wire, in the same sense, and this may confuse an elementary student. On p. 155 there appears to be a misprint  $Lp = \frac{i_s}{T^2}$  being given instead of  $Lp = \frac{Ls}{T^2}$ .

On the whole the book is one which we would recommend every student of telegraphy as well as of wireless telegraphy to read as the effort of absorbing the salient facts of the subject is rendered very small by the simplicity of the method of explanation.

method of taking periodical readings of both specific gravity and terminal P.D. on discharge of the individual cells of a battery allows the advantages of specific gravity regulation to be made use of when conditions permit, at the same time preventing trouble being overlooked.

The two cells to which 8 refers were in the same battery and received precisely the same treatment at every stage from erection. The "bad" cell was never short circuited, and every effort was made to bring it up to its rated capacity by working and additional charging without avail. The trouble was traced to the positive plates (see 9), and new ones were fitted. It was then actually a "bad" cell, though the argument applies equally well to a "faulty' cell, using that term for a cell which, though out of order, can be cured by treatment, whereas no remedy but replating is of use for a "bad" cell.

THE Board of Editors has great pleasure in publishing the further list of honours awarded to members of the Engineering Department on active service:

Sergeant A. J. Knight, Post Office Rifles (Clerical Assistant, North Midland District). Awarded the Victoria Cross. The report in the 'London Gazette,' detailing the deeds of valour performed by Sergeant Knight, reads:

"For most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty during the operations against the enemy positions.

"Sergeant Knight did extraordinary good work, and showed exceptional bravery and initiative when his platoon was attacking an enemy strong point, and came under very heavy fire from an enemy machine-gun. He rushed through our own barrage, bayoneted the enemy gunner, and captured the position single-handed.

"Later, twelve of the enemy with a machine-gun were encountered in a shell-hole. He again rushed forward by himself, bayoneted two and shot a third, and caused the remainder to scatter.

"Subsequently, during the attack on a fortified farm, when entangled up to his waist in mud, and seeing a number of the enemy firing on our troops, he immediately opened fire on them without waiting to extricate himself from the mud, killing six of the enemy.

"Again noticing the company on his right flank being held up in their attack on another farm, Sergeant Knight collected some men

and took up a position on the flank of this farm, from where he brought a heavy fire to bear on the farm, as a result of which the

farm was captured.

"All the platoon officers of the company had become casualties before the first objective was reached, and this gallant N.C.O. took command of all the men of his own platoon and of the platoons without officers. His energy in consolidating and reorganising was untiring.

"His several single-handed actions showed exceptional bravery, and saved a great many casualties in the company. They were

performed under heavy machine-gun and rifle fire, and without regard to personal risk, and were the direct cause of the objectives being captured."

The following description by an officer eye-witness is taken from the 'Nottingham Daily Express' of November 12th, and gives a fuller account of the consistent gallantry of Sergeant Knight:

"My own view is," says the writer, "that the deed which won the recommendation for the Cross for Knight was the finest deed of the whole war. He has had a consistently good record, and the deeds mentioned in the official statement were deeds such as any man might be proud of. On the day I speak of, the battalion with which Knight was serving came in for a rough handling. They had advanced over very difficult ground, and were in the open without any available cover. Suddenly fire was opened on them from a machine-gun post which had not up to then been located. The attack from this

quarter was sudden, and the fire so deadly that the situation was most critical. What made matters worse was the fact that our own barrage was just creeping forward in front of us, and to attack and silence this new enemy it was necessary to dash through our barrage as well as the machine-gun fire.

"Knight was one of the first to come under fire, and he stood on a spot swept by bullets. He never lost his head. He dashed ahead in spite of the rain of bullets from the machine-gun, in spite of the heavy barrage from our own guns, and drove his bayonet into the German working the gun. The rest of them took to their heels, and left the brave sergeant in possession of the post. That made possible our advance a stage further, and we went on until we came to some broken ground, where the enemy had established a chain of machine-gun posts in shell-holes. In one of these holes about a dozen of the enemy were posted with a machine-gun, which they kept firing across and sweeping the ground with a very fierce fire.

"Fixing his bayonet, Knight said, 'I'm after this, boys,' and simply went for the whole bunch of the enemy as though it were only sham-fighting. He got in with the bayonet on two of the enemy, though they were trying their hardest to bring him down, and he shot a third. The other chaps didn't like the look of the thing, so they made off, and once more our line swept forward, thanks to the fine courage of this fine soldier.

"On another occasion our men were having a mud bath in their efforts to get at a position. Knight floundered into a very bad mud patch and was held up to the waist, but he saw a chance of turning his bad luck to good account, and, anchored out there in the mud, he opened fire on the enemy holding the farm, and when he had killed about half a dozen, the enemy thought they had enough of him, so they cleared off, and once again our line surged forward. It was an uneven advance, because the adjoining company was held up by heavy machine-gun fire, and a frontal attack seemed to be as good, or as bad, as suicide.

"Knight got together a party of his men, went forward with them, and attacked the enemy in flank. They gave way, and the attack was successful. It is not exaggerating to say that the entire command of the troops in these operations fell on Knight, and had he failed the chances are that the whole of the work put in in that particular push would have been in vain.

"The heroism and ability of Sergeant Knight have been the subject of special consideration by his superiors, and more notice will be taken of him with the object of securing for the Army in a more responsible position the services of one who is a born leader of men. He is idolised by his comrades, who have absolute condence in his judgment, and his courage is infectious. The men

would follow him anywhere. He is a thoroughly fine type of soldier, and a credit to his regiment and the district to which he belongs. Withal he is a modest man, and would be the last to claim that he has done more than his duty in the war. He was commended for good work before the latest instance, and his superiors had already formed a high opinion of him."

Taking the example given in his communication in the April, 1917, number: No.  $\bar{\imath}$  wire gave a resistance of 120 ohms, of which 100 ohms represented line resistance and 20 ohms " earth." Another wire was then placed in parallel and the reading was 70 ohms. The natural inference is that No. 2 wire has a resistance of 168 ohms, as  $\frac{120 \times 168}{120 + 168} = 70$ . But Mr. Jack says no, No. 2 wire is in intimate contact with No.  $\bar{\imath}$  at the fault, and the reading obtained is a result of a joint resistance of  $\frac{100 \times 100}{100 + 100} = 50$ , plus the original 20 ohms earth. But how is one to recognise this? How is one to discover, testing for an unknown fault, that the resistance of the line only has been halved by joining the wires in parallel?

I maintain that it would be an incorrect assumption in ninety-nine out of one hundred cases.

## A BREEZE FROM CEYLON'S ISLE.

THE following letter from Mr. G. H. Schofield will no doubt prove of interest to his many friends throughout the Service:

CENTRAL TELEGRAPH OFFICE, COLOMBO,

February 15th, 1918.

DEAR MR. NOBLE,—I arrived here safe and sound on the r2th of last month after a most interesting voyage of practically six weeks to find "our Mac." was just as cheerful as ever, altered neither in speech nor dress, except the latter was white, and he had on a big "pig-sticker" topee. He is the big white chief out here, the Press reporting his official movements as they do those of the Premier at home. Personally, up to the present, I am very pleased with the change. There is plenty of work of all descriptions, and I have been placed in charge of the Colombo Telephone Service in particular, though the out-stations, small exchanges, and lines are also under my supervision; I say for the present, because everyone tells me I shall soon become very home sick, and long to leave the most beautiful isle in the sea.

I thought of your anticipated voyage round the world after retirement as our best crept into the different perts, or we sighted land and sailed along parallel with the African coast, giving a glimpse of Algiers and beyond, the mountains and the desert.

Leaving Plymouth in the afternoon we were soon past the Eddy-stone light, and I saw the last of England. I was now really off, and I must make the best of everything, good or bad.

Thirteen other vessels and two war sloops formed the convoy, and so we proceeded to Malta without a stop, where owing to enemy submarines we had to shelter for eight days, ultimately sailing at sunset. They saw us, however, and fired a torpedo, missing the stern by 5 ft. The other thirteen vessels had left us at Gib., so that the men-of-war on either side were able to give the Huns their whole attention; that was their first and last attempt.

Malta is a most interesting place, the cathedral with its many magnificent works of art being especially worthy of attention, beating anything I have seen in Europe, including Cologne.

Port Said was our next stop, and as we entered the harbour we all felt relieved that our anxiety on being sunk by a "tin fish" was over. Here I saw my first Egyptians, and was much amused

useful in the latter case, the absence of pilot pairs entailed more testing and proving of the circuits in the course of restoration than would otherwise have been necessary.

The work of jointing occupied in all 140 hours—a very good record in all the circumstances, as operations could be conducted on one cable only at a time. No crosses or other faults were introduced. In all, sixteen ducts were broken and three eables destroyed, involving 1406 circuits, including spares.

evening, November 29th, at the Society of Arts, Adelphi, W.C. Sir William Slingo presided over a large attendance. A most interesting paper was read by Mr. A. B. Hart, of the Engineer-in-Chief's Office, on "Telephone Repeaters." The development that has taken place in the last year or two was heard with some surprise by many present, as very little information on the subject has appeared in the technical Press for obvious reasons.

Professor Fleming, of London University, opened the discussion, and reviewed the evolution of the valve for wireless and telephone work, and also explained its action. He humorously suggested its application to subscribers' telephones.

The following speakers also took part: Messrs. C. Robinson, J. E. Taylor, Penny (Western Electric Company), Pollock, Twells, Ritter, Cruickshank, Bartholomew and Gibbon. The chairman reviewed the subject and pointed out its importance with regard to the weight of conductors on main lines. Mr. Hart replied, and concluded by saying that their ideal was to maintain the efficiency of the speaking circuits and to reduce the copper, even to vanishing point.

The paper forms a distinct milestone on the road of progress, and there is every likelihood of its being published by the Institution for circulation among the members.

## **BOOK** REVIEW.

'Standard Tables and Equations in Radio-Telegraphy.' By Bertram Hoyle, M.Sc.Tech., A.M.I.E.E. (London: The Wireless Press, Ltd. Pp. 159. Price 9s. net.)

The book consists, in the main, of a collection of tables and formulæ of particular use to the wireless engineer. Although most of the information is available in a scattered form in the text-books and engineering year books already published, yet some very useful purpose is served in collecting under one cover for reference information germane to a particular branch of engineering; it is in this direction that the chief recommendation of the book is to be found. The usefulness of the formulæ is enhanced by Section 3, which is devoted to typical worked examples of the application of some of the formulæ.

Section 4, however, which purports to be "Notes on Elementary Arithmetic for Operators," gives the method of contracted multiplication and division and the simpler trignometrical ratios. This section, together with illustrations showing the theoretical mechanical advantages of various simple forms of pulleys, could, with advantage, have been omitted; in our opinion it savours of padding.

On p. 20 the formula for wave-length is given as  $1885 \sqrt{KL}$  metres, without reference to the fact that K and L are in microfarads and microhenries respectively, but this is apparently a displacement by the printer, and will, no doubt, be rectified in future issues.

On the whole the book is free from error, and can be recommended as a comprehensive collection of tables and formulæ for the use of the wireless engineer.

A good index adds to the usefulness of the volume.

and with valves in parallel and a brief description of the multivibrateur form the material for an important chapter. Characteristics and descriptions of practically every type of receiver valve are given, and special valve designs, such as the Dynatron, Pliodynatron and valves used as limiters are also included. Continuous-wave transmission, with illustrations of modern transmitting valves and circuits both for telegraphy and telephony and continuous-wave and radio-telephony reception, are described very fully. High-frequency alternators and frequency multipliers are briefly described. Earthcurrent signalling and miscellaneous valve apparatus, including a brief reference to valve amplifiers on telephone lines, are such as to maintain one's interest in the book up to the last page. The author states that he had much opportunity of studying this subject whilst in France, and he is to be congratulated on so promptly publishing such a comprehensive record of the information gathered. volume is quite a self-contained treatise on valves, and is one we can recommend to the serious attention of all workers in the radio art.
