





Your Freestyle 2010 has been designed for ease of use and made to the high standards set by BT


Please read the instructions carefully before use and retain this user guide for future reference.

By purchasing the Freestyle 2010 you now own a product which combines the advantages of cordless operation with the performance of a high quality corded telephone. It complies with the Digitally Enhanced Cordless Telecommunications (DECT) standard and offers unparalleled quality and features.

Building up a phone system

You can use up to 5 handsets with your Freestyle 2010 base station without the need for additional wiring.



This user guide applies to both single and multiple handset systems. The internal call functions described in this guide apply only to Freestyle 2010 base stations with more than one handset connected.

Important

If you wear a hearing aid, please note that the Freestyle 2010 works by sending radio signals between the base station and the handset. These signals may interfere with some hearing aids, causing a humming noise.

Safety information

General

Only use the power supply included with the product. Using an unauthorised power supply will invalidate your guarantee and may damage the telephone. The item number for the mains power supply is 005977.

Only use the approved rechargeable batteries supplied. Spare rechargeable batteries – are available from the Freestyle Helpline **0870 240 3962**.

If the keypad is locked, it is STILL possible to make emergency calls to 999 and 112.

Do not open the handset (except to replace the handset batteries) or base station. This could expose you to high voltages or other risks. Contact the helpline for all repairs.

Radio signals transmitted between the handset and base may cause interference to hearing aids.

It is recommended that advice from a qualified expert be sought before using this product in the vicinity of emergency/intensive care medical equipment.

It is recommended that if you have a pacemaker fitted you check with a medical expert before using this product.

Never dispose of batteries in a fire. There is a serious risk of explosion and/ or the release of highly toxic chemicals.

Cleaning

Simply clean the handset and base station with a damp (not wet) cloth, or an antistatic wipe. Never use household polish as this will damage the product. Never use a dry cloth as this may cause a static shock.

Environmental

Do not expose to direct sunlight.

The product may heat up when the batteries are being recharged or during prolonged periods of use. This is normal. However, we recommend that you do not place the product on antique/veneered wood to avoid damage.

Do not stand your product on carpets or other surfaces which generate fibres, or place it in locations preventing free flow of air over its surfaces.

Do not submerge any part of your product in water and do not use it in damp or humid conditions, such as in bathrooms.

Do not expose your product to fire, explosive or other hazardous conditions.

There is a slight chance that your phone could be damaged by an electrical storm. We recommend that you unplug the power and telephone line cord for the duration of the storm.

Setting up

Follow these steps to set up your Freestyle 2010 ready for use

Plan the location of your Freestyle 2010

The following points should be considered:

- Situate your product close enough to the power socket so that the cable will reach safely without stretching. Ensure that you plan the location so that the mains power is easily accessible in case you need to disconnect the power.
- Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical products to avoid interference.


Please note

The Freestyle 2010 has a range of up to 300 metres outdoors and up to 50 metres indoors. The range will be reduced when there is no clear line of sight between the base and handset. Thick stone walls can severely affect the range.



Connect the power cable

Plug the power cable into the power socket on your Freestyle base station and route the cord around the catch at the top as shown.



Plug the adaptor into the mains power supply and switch on

Install the rechargeable batteries in the handset



The handset uses two rechargeable Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH) AAA batteries which are supplied. Take care to insert the batteries as shown and then fit the battery cover (the battery cover may be found in the packaging with the batteries).



Charge the handset batteries for at least 16 hours

Before you use your Freestyle 2010 for the first time, it is important to have the handset batteries fully charged. The batteries need to charge continuously for at least 16 hours to reach full charge.

Place the handset on the base. The handset comes pre-registered to the base station as FREESTYLE 1. This is shown on the display.

The battery symbol is also shown on the display. It flashes during charging. Once the handset is fully charged, the display shows a full battery symbol.

Battery levels Empty 33% 66% 100% flashing

Battery low warning.

If the handset battery symbol is empty and flashing, and you hear a warning beep every 10 seconds, you will need to recharge your handset before you can use it.

Battery performance

Under no circumstances should non-rechargeable batteries be used. Only use the approved batteries, type: rechargeable Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH); Size AAA; Capacity 600 mAh. Using unapproved batteries will invalidate your guarantee and may damage the telephone.

To keep your battery in the best condition, leave the handset off the base station for a few hours at a time (after the initial 16 hour charge).

Please note, however, that new Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH) batteries do not reach their full capacity until they have been in normal use for several days.

Fully discharging the batteries at least once a week will help them to last as long as possible. However, the charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, so reducing the talk/standby time of the handset. Eventually they will need to be replaced.

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
Please note

Under ideal conditions, the handset battery should give about 12 hours talktime or 120 hours standby on a single charge. Optimum times for talk and standby are only achieved when the handset batteries are new and fully charged.



Connect the telephone line cord to the Freestyle 2010 base station

Plug the line cord into the line socket on your Freestyle base station.




Please note

It is recommended that you do not connect the telephone line cord to the phone socket until your handset is fully charged. This will prevent the risk of the batteries discharging during a conversation, which would cause you to lose the call.



Connect the telephone line cord



If you do not have modern phone sockets, call **Free***fone 0800* **800 150** and ask for a BT engineer to come and fit the correct type. This is a chargeable service.

Your Freestyle 2010 is now ready for use

Pre-set PINs

Your Freestyle 2010 comes with a pre-set PIN which you will need to use to perform various functions on your phone.

When you enter the PIN, the display will not show it for security reasons.

The PIN, pre-set to 0000, is used when adjusting base station settings and registering new handsets. It can be changed.



Using your Freestyle 2010 telephone

Please note

To exit and return to the previous menu at any time, press the X button. If you keep pressing the X button you will return to the standby screen.





When you have entered the number correctly, press the **TALK** button to dial the number.

Making and receiving calls

To make a call



Press the **TALK** button.
The display will show the icon and you will hear the dial tone.



Enter the telephone number. The number is dialled automatically.

Preparatory dialling

Preparatory dialling allows you to enter the number before pressing the **TALK** button. This enables you to correct any mistakes before you actually make the call.



First enter the telephone number to be dialled.

To end a call



Press the TALK button.

Or

Place the handset back in the base.

To receive a call

When the telephone rings the display will show CALL and the cicon will flash.


If you have subscribed to a Caller Display Service your caller's number will be shown (or the name if it is stored in your directory).



Press the **TALK** button or pick the handset up from the base to answer the call.

To withhold your number when making a call

If you do not want your telephone number sent to the person you are calling you can withhold it. You will need to do this each time you make a call.



The display will show REDIAL.

Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows WITHHOLD.

Press the **b**utton.
The display will show

The display will show DIAL NOW.

Press the TALK button.

Enter the number you want to dial.

The withhold code will be dialled and then the telephone number.

To adjust the speech volume during a call

During a call you can adjust the speech volume of your caller. There are 3 volume levels: low ■, medium ■ and high ■ ■ ■.

During a call:

Press the **MENU** button. (You need to wait until a forward arrow ▶ appears in the display.)



Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows IN CALL VOL.



Press the **b**utton.

The display will show the current level with a tick on the right of the display.

e.g., ■■■ **✓**.



Press the **DOWN** button to increase the volume.



Once the maximum level is reached, press the **DOWN** button to return to the lowest level.



When you have reached the level you require, press the \checkmark button. The volume will not change until the \checkmark is pressed.

The display will show STORED.

Secrecy

When on a call you can talk to someone in the same room without your caller hearing.

To switch secrecy on and off

During a call:



Press the **★** button. The display will show the **⋈** icon. Your caller cannot hear you.



Press the **X** button again to return to your caller.

Menu

Last number redial

Your handset automatically saves the last 8 numbers dialled into a redial list.


To view and dial a number in the redial list



Press the **MENU** button.



The display will show REDIAL.



The last number called will be displayed.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll through and view the numbers in the redial list.



Press the TALK button to dial the number displayed.

To edit and then call a number in the redial list



Press the MENU button.



Press the **V** button.

The last number called will be displayed.

The display will show REDIAL.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll through to the number you want to edit.



Press the **MENU** button.



The display will show CHANGE.

Press the **b**utton.



Use the **X** button to delete unwanted digits and re-enter the correct ones using the keypad.



Press the **b**utton to dial the number.

The edited number will be added to the redial list.

To delete a number in the redial list



Press the **MENU** button.



The display will show REDIAL.



Press the **V** button.

The last number called will be displayed.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll through to the number you want to delete



Press the **MENU** button.



The display will show CHANGE. Press the **DOWN** button until the



display shows DELETE.



Press the **b**utton.

The display will show 2 - DELETE - 2



Press the **b**utton to confirm. (Or if you decide not to delete, press the **X** button.)

The display will show DELETED and you will hear a confirmation beep.

To delete the whole redial list



Press the MENU button.



The display will show REDIAL.



Press the **b**utton.

The last number called will be displayed.



Press the MENU button.

The display will show CHANGE.



Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows DELETE LIST.



Press the **b**utton.

The display will show 2 - DELETE -2



Press the **V** button to confirm. (Or if you decide not to delete, press the **X** button.)

The display will show DELETED and then EMPTY. You will hear a confirmation beep.

Name and number directory

You can store up to 27 of your most frequently dialled names and numbers in your Freestyle 2010: 20 in the personal directory and 7 in the shared directory. Please note that names can be up to 11 characters and numbers up to 24 digits long.

Names and numbers in the shared directory can be accessed by other Freestyle 2010 handsets that are registered to your base.

To store a name and number in the personal directory



Press the PERSONAL DIRECTORY button.

The display will show EMPTY if there are no numbers stored.



Press the MENU button.

The display will show NEW.



Press the **b**utton.

The display will show a flashing cursor and NUMBER (or FULL if the directory is already full).



Enter the telephone number using the numbers on the keypad. (If you make a mistake, press the **X** button to delete incorrect digits and re-enter the correct ones).

Please note

If you subscribe to a Caller Display Service (see page 19) and want directory names to be displayed when a call is received from one of your directory numbers. you must ensure that you always enter the full telephone number, including the national code.



Press the **b**utton to confirm.

The display will show STORED and then a flashing cursor and NAME.



Enter the name using the letters on the keypad. (If you make a mistake, press the **X** button to delete incorrect letters and re-enter the correct ones). Please note that the figure 0 equals a space when using the keypad letters.

For example to enter the name TOM:-



To enter the letter T, press the **8** button. The cursor will automatically move to the right.



To enter the letter O, press the **6** button *three times*.

Wait for the cursor to move to the next position and then:-



To enter the letter M, press the **6** button.



Press the **V** button to confirm.

The display will show STORED and you will hear a confirmation beep.



Press the **X** button until you return to the standby screen.

To store a name and number in the shared directory



Press the **SHARED DIRECTORY** button.

The display will show EMPTY if there are no numbers stored.



Unless already displayed, press the **DOWN** button until display shows EMPTY.



Press the **MENU** button.



The display will show CHANGE.

✓ Press the ✓ button.

The display will show a flashing cursor and NUMBER.

Enter the telephone number using the numbers on the keypad. (If you make a mistake, press the button to delete incorrect digits and re-enter the correct ones.)



Press the **b**utton to confirm.

The display will show STORED and then a flashing cursor and NAME.



Enter the name using the letters on the keypad. (If you make a mistake, press the **X** button to delete incorrect letters and re-enter the correct ones.)

For example to enter the name TOM:-



To enter the letter T, press the **8** button. The cursor will automatically move to the right.



To enter the letter O, press the **6** button *three times*. Wait for the cursor to move to the next position and then:-



To enter the letter M, press the 6 button.



Press the **V** button to confirm.

The display will show STORED and you will hear a confirmation beep.



Press the **X** button until you return to the standby screen.

To enter a pause in a stored number

When storing a number, you can insert a pause in the number when the cursor is at the appropriate point, by pressing and holding the button until a P appears in the display.


Please note that you can also program your Freestyle 2010 to automatically wait for a dial tone when connected to a switchboard. see page 39.

To dial a number in the directory



SHARED DIRECTORY button.

The first entry will be shown.



Or

When using the personal directory. you can search alphabetically for names using the keypad. For example, pressing the 4 button once will take you to the first entry starting with 5. Pressing the 4 button three times will take you to the first entry starting with I.



Press the TALK button to dial the number.

To edit an entry in the personal directory



Press the PERSONAL DIRECTORY button.

The first entry will be shown.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll through to the entry you want to edit.



Press the MENU button. NFW will be displayed.



Press the **DOWN** button. The display will show CHANGE.



Press the **b**utton.

The number will be shown. Use the **X** button to delete unwanted digits and re-enter the correct ones.



When the number is correct, press the **b**utton.

The display will show STORED and you will hear a confirmation beep.



The display will then show the name. Edit the name.



Press the **b**utton when the name is correct.

The display will show STORED and vou will hear a confirmation beep.



Press the **X** button until vou return to the standby screen.

To delete an entry in the personal directory



Press the **PERSONAL DIRECTORY** button.

The first entry will be shown.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll through to the entry you want to delete.



Press the **MENU** button. NEW will be displayed.



Press the **DOWN** button until the display will shows DELETE.



Press the **✓** button. The display will show ? - DELETE - ?



Press the **v** button to confirm. (Or if you decide not to delete, press the **x** button).

The display will show DELETED and you will hear a confirmation beep.



Press the **X** button until you return to the standby screen.

To edit an entry in the shared directory



Press the **SHARED DIRECTORY** button.

The first entry will be shown.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll through to the entry you want to edit.



Press the **MENU** button. CHANGE will be displayed.



Press the **V** button.



The number will be shown. Use the **X** button to delete unwanted digits and re-enter the correct ones.

The display will show STORED and you will hear a confirmation beep.

The display will then show the name.

Edit the name.



Press the **V** button when the name is correct.

The display will show STORED and you will hear a confirmation beep.



Press the \boldsymbol{X} button until you return to the standby screen.

To delete an entry in the shared directory



Press the **SHARED DIRECTORY** button.

The first entry will be shown.



Use the **DOWN** button to scroll through to the entry you want to delete.



Press the **MENU** button. CHANGE will be displayed.



Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows DELETE.



Press the **V** button.

The display will show ? - DELETE - ?



Press the **v** button to confirm. (Or if you decide not to delete, press the **x** button.)

The display will show DELETED and you will hear a confirmation beep.



Press the **X** button until you return to the standby screen.

Paging handsets

You can page your handset (s) from the base station to alert a handset user that they are wanted or to locate a missing handset. Please note that paging calls cannot be answered by a handset.

To page a handset from the base



Press the **PAGE** button on the base.

The handset(s) will ring.



To stop paging, press the **PAGE** button *again*.

Or



To stop paging, press the **TALK** button on the handset.

Caller Display and Call Waiting

Important

To use Caller Display or Call Waiting you must first subscribe to your network provider's Caller Display or Call Waiting Service. A quarterly fee is payable.

For more information on BT's Select Services, call BT free on **0800 800 150**.

Using Caller Display

If you subscribe to a Caller Display Service you can see your caller's number (provided it is not withheld) on your handset display before you answer the call. If you have your caller's name and number stored in your personal directory, you will see the name of your caller displayed instead of the number. (Please note your Freestyle 2010 will not match incoming numbers to names stored in the shared directory.)

When a call is not answered (or is answered on a telephone on another extension), your caller's telephone number (or name if stored in the directory) will be stored in a Calls list. The Calls list holds up to 10 calls. When the Calls list is full the oldest call will be replaced by a new call, but the latest call will always be at the top of the list. If a caller rings again their number or (name) will move to the top of the list.

Ringback calls will display the number dialled when you requested the ringback service.

New call indication

When a new call is received in the Calls list the display will show NEW CALLS. This message will remain on the display until you have viewed all new calls in the Calls list.

To view the Calls list



Press the **MENU** button. The display will show REDIAL.



Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows CALLS LIST.



Press the **/** button.

The most recent call in the list will be shown on the display. (If there are no numbers the display will show EMPTY.)



Press the **DOWN** button to scroll through the Calls list entries.



Press the **X** button to exit the list.

Caller information not available

With some incoming calls the telephone number of the caller is not available and cannot therefore be displayed.

In this case, your Freestyle 2010 provides you with some explanatory information about the type of call you have received. This will be one of the following:

The number is unavailable.

UNAVAILABLE

The call has been made via the operator.

UNAVAILABLE

The caller has withheld their number.

WITHHELD

International call.

UNAVAILABLE

The caller is ringing from a payphone.

UNAVAILABLE

Please note

Withheld and unavailable calls will not be stored in the Calls list.

To dial a number from the Calls list



Press the **MENU** button. The display will show REDIAL.



Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows CALLS LIST.



Press the **V** button.

The most recent call in the list will be shown on the display.



Press the **DOWN** button to scroll through to the number you want to dial.



Press the **TALK** button.

The number is dialled automatically.

To delete a number from the Calls list



Press the **MENU** button. The display will show REDIAL.



Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows CALLS LIST.



Press the **V** button.

The most recent call in the list will be shown on the display.



Press the **DOWN** button to scroll through to the number you want to delete.



Press the **MENU** button. The display will show DELETE.

Using Call Waiting

To switch Call Waiting on and off

If you subscribe to a Call Waiting Service from your network provider, the codes to switch it on and off are stored in your Freestyle 2010.

- Press the **MENU** button. The display will show REDIAL.
- Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows BS SETTINGS.
- Press the **V** button. The display will show AUDIO.
- Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows NET SERVICE.
- Press the **V** button. The display will show CALL WAITING.
- Press the **V** button to confirm.
 - Use the **DOWN** button to display either ON or OFF (the current setting will have a \checkmark next to it).
- The appropriate code will be dialled to line and the display shows PLS LISTEN.

Press the **V** button to confirm.


You will hear the announcement from the exchange "Call waiting is switched on" or "Call waiting is cancelled".

Press the **TALK** button to return to standby.



To accept a Call Waiting call

If you hear the tone which tells you that you have another caller, whilst you are on a call:—



Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows RECALL.

Press the **/** button. The current call will be put on hold and you will be connected to the new caller.


To reconnect to the first call, select RECALL again.


Handset settings

To switch the handset off



The display will show REDIAL.





Press the **b**utton to confirm.

The display will go blank and the handset is now switched off.

To switch the handset on

Press the **TALK** button.

The display will show SEARCHING and then return to the standby screen.

To adjust the handset ringer volume

There are 5 handset ringer volume levels to choose from where ■ is the minimum and ■ ■ ■ ■ is the maximum level.

Press the **MENU** button. The display will show REDIAL.

Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows HS SETTINGS.

Press the **b**utton.

The display will show AUDIO.

Press the button.
The display will show RING VOLUME.

Press the **V** button.

Use the **DOWN** button to select the ringer volume level you require.
You will hear a sample ring with each press. (The current level will have a next to it.) The volume will not change until the is pressed.

Press the **V** button to select the setting. You will hear a confirmation beep.

The display will show STORED and then RING VOLUME.

Press the **X** button until you return to the standby screen.

To adjust the handset ringer melody

There are 6 handset ringer melodies to choose from MELODY 1-6.



Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows HS SETTINGS.

Press the **V** button.

The display will show AUDIO.

Press the **V** button.

The display will show RING VOLUME.

Press the **DOWN** button until the

display shows RING MELODY.

Press the button.

Use the **DOWN** button to select a melody (1-6). You will hear a sample melody on each press. (The current melody will have a ✔ next to it.)

Press the **/** button to select the melody. You will hear a confirmation beep.

The display will show STORED and then RING MELODY.

Press the **X** button until you return to the standby screen.

To adjust the speech volume

There are 3 speech volume levels to choose from where ■ is the minimum and ■ ■ ■ is the maximum level. You can also adjust the speech volume during a call, *see page 13*.

Press the **MENU** button. The display will show REDIAL.



There are 5 base ringer volume levels to choose from where ■ is the minimum and maximum level and vou can also switch the base ringer off (VOL OFF).

Using additional handsets and bases

As well as your original handset, you can register up to a further 4 additional handsets to vour Freestyle 2010 base station. You can also register and use your handset on up to 4 base stations to build up a comprehensive telephone system.

If you have additional handsets registered to the base you can make internal calls and transfer calls between handsets. Two handsets can be on an internal call while a third is making an external call. You can even have a three-way conversation.

Please note

Each additional handset you purchase must be registered to the base station and you must remember to charge new handsets for at least 16 hours before use. When a new handset is switched on the display will show REGISTER! to indicate that it needs to be registered to a base station.



Inquiry calls, transferring calls and conference calls

During a call you can contact another Freestyle handset (which is registered to your base station) without losing the initial call. You can then speak to either party independently, have a 3-way conversation or you can transfer the call to the other handset.

During a call:



Press the **MENU** button. (You need to wait until a forward arrow ▶ appears in the display.)

The display will show INQUIRY.



Press the **DOWN** button until the display shows INTERN INQ.



Press the **V** button.



Enter the number of the handset you want to contact (e.g. if the other handset is Freestyle 3, enter a 3). The display on your handset will show the name and number of the called handset and the other handset will ring (the original call will be put on hold).

The display will show INTERN NBR.



When the other handset answers, (if it doesn't answer, press the TALK button to return to your original call) you can hold a conversation whilst your original call is on hold. If the second handset hangs up you will be returned to your original call.



Whilst talking to the second handset press the **MENU** button.

CONFERENCE and SWAP CALLS.

Selecting SWAP CALLS will switch you back to the original call but keep the other call on hold (select SWAP) CALLS again to go back to the other call).

You can select RECALL to perform other Three Way Calling Functions (See your Three Way Calling User Guide).



When an access code has been set. whenever your Freestyle 2010 sees the access code as the first digit(s) of a dialled number, it will wait until it hears the dial tone before it dials the rest of the number.







