Welcome...

to your BT Freestyle 6300 Digital Cordless Telephone

- Digital call quality with a range of up to 300 metres outdoors and up to 50 metres indoors.
- 100 Name and number directory in the base and another 100 in the handset.
- Make, receive and transfer calls directly from the base using the built in loudspeaker.
- Caller Display* lets you see who is calling and keep track of unanswered calls.
- Call Waiting* lets you know, during a call, that another caller is waiting to get through.
- Redial any of the last 20 numbers from a handset or the last 10 numbers from the base
- Use up to 5 handsets with your base without the need for additional wiring, creating a complete phone system on a single telephone line.
 - Requires subscription to your network provider's Caller Display and Call Waiting services. A quarterly fee is payable.

Please note that this equipment is not designed for making emergency telephone calls when the power fails. Alternative arrangements should be made for access to emergency services.



This User Guide provides you with all the information you need to get the most from your phone.

Before you make your first call you'll need to set up your phone. This doesn't take long and is easy to do. Just follow the simple instructions on the next few pages.

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Getting started

WARNING

Do not place your BT Freestyle 6300 in the bathroom or other humid areas

Handset range

The BT Freestyle 6300 has a range of 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the hase and handset. When there is no clear line of sight between the base and handset, e.g. base indoors and handset either indoors or outdoors, the range could be reduced to 50 metres. Thick stone walls will severely affect the range.

Range indicator

The V symbol on your handset display indicates when you are in range of the base. If the symbol flashes and you hear a warning beep, you are out of range and will need to move closer to the base.

IMPORTANT

Do not connect the telephone line until your handset is fully charged.

The base must be plugged into the mains power at all times.

Location


You need to place your BT Freestyle 6300 close enough to a mains power and telephone socket so that the cables will reach

Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference.


Your BT Freestyle 6300 works by sending radio signals between the handset and base. The strength of the signal depends on where you site the base. Putting it as high as possible can help to provide the best signal.

Setting up


1. Plug the mains power cable into the base. Then plug the power adaptor into the wall socket and switch the power on. The **Power/In use** indicator on the base lights up.



 Remove the battery compartment cover and insert the 2 x AAA NiMH batteries (supplied) into the handset.
 Slide the battery compartment cover back into place.



- 3. Charge the handset for at least 24 hours by placing it on the base. The red Charging indicator on the base lights up and remains lit while the handset is on the base (even when the battery is fully charged). When the handset is fully charged the display will show a full battery icon.
- After 24 hours, plug the telephone line cord into your BT Freestyle 6300 base and the other end into the wall socket.



Your BT Freestyle 6300 is now ready for use.

Talk/Standby time

Under ideal conditions, fully charged handset batteries should provide up to 10 hours talk time or 100 hours standby on a single charge.

Battery performance

Please note that new NiMH batteries do not reach full capacity until they have been in normal use for several days.

To keep the batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the charger for a few hours at a time (after the initial 24 hour charge). Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, so reducing the talk/standby time of the handset. Eventually they will need to be replaced. New batteries can be obtained from the BT Freestyle Helpline 0870 605 8047.

Battery low warning

When the battery charge is low the display will show Batters Low and an empty battery icon . You will also hear the battery low warning beep. Place the handset back on the base to recharge.

Amplify

Press to increase the volume of the incoming caller volume, *page 17*.

On-screen option button -

Opens the main menu, page 13.

Selects the option shown on the display, page 13.

Scroll/Redial list/Volume

Scroll through menu options.

Press **up** to open redial list, page 21.

During a call, press to increase earpiece volume.

Talk/Handsfree

Press to make and receive calls, page 16.

During a call, press to switch between handset and handsfree, page 18.

Recall/Call Waiting

For use with a switchboard and BT Calling Features.

For use with Call Waiting, page 39.

Incoming call indicator

Flashes to indicate an incoming call.

On-screen option button

Open the directory, page 24.

Selects the option shown on the display, *page 13*.

Use to delete characters/digits.

Scroll/Calls list/Volume

Scroll through menu options.

Press **down** to open calls list, *page 35*.

During a call, press to decrease earpiece volume.

End/Clear/Exit/Power on/off Press to end a call, page 16.

Exit menus, page 13.

Press and hold to switch the power off. Press any button momentarily to switch power back on, page 16.


Press and hold to activate keypad lock, *page 18*.

Int

Make calls between handsets registered to the base, *page 52*.



Handset display icons – These are the symbols you will see on your handset's screen.





Range indicator

Indicates that the handset is registered and you are in range of the base.

Flashes when the base is out of range.



New calls indicator*

Displayed when you have new (unread) entries in the Calls list, *page 35*. The icon will continue to flash until you have viewed all new calls.



Handsfree

Indicates when handsfree is switched on, page 18.



Keypad locked

Indicates the keypad is locked, page 18.



Alarm set

Indicates an alarm is set, page 43.



In use

Displayed when making or receiving a call, page 16.

Battery status

Shows the battery charge level.

A 'scrolling' battery icon is displayed when the handset is on charge.




Upper case selected

Displayed when you have upper case character lock on, *page 25*.






Note

The handset should be placed on the base face down only. The red charging light will come on.

IMPORTANT

When in standby, no menu options are displayed on the base screen.

Navigating the menus

Your BT Freestyle 6300 has a menu system which is easy to use. Each menu leads to a list of options. Take a look at the menu map on the following page.

Handset

When the handset is in standby, press the **option** button under Menu to open the main menu

Use the or buttons to scroll to the menu option you want. Then select OK for further options or confirm the setting displayed.


The option buttons and or buttons are also used when viewing the calls list and directory.



Select the option displayed by pressing the button underneath it.

For example, press the left-hand option button to select Menu and open the main menu, or press the right-hand option button to open the directory.

Base



The base works in exactly the same way. Press the menu button then select the option displayed by pressing the button underneath it.

Exit or go back one level in the menu

To go to the previous level in the menu, select **Back**.

To cancel an operation and/or return to standby at any time, press .

If no button is pressed for 20 seconds the display will automatically return to standby.






Using the phone

Power On/Off

Press and hold to switch the power off. Press any button momentarily to switch the power back on

Dialling numbers quickly

Numbers can also be dialled direct from the directory (page 27), the dialled numbers list (page 21), or the calls list (page 35).

Call timer

The duration of your call is shown during and after your call has ended for a short while.

Auto Talk

If you would rather press to receive a call when the handset is on the base, you need to switch Auto Talk off, see page 41.

Making and receiving calls with the handset

Make an external call

1. Press . When you hear the dialling tone, dial the telephone number.

The green In Use light on the base flashes and the cicon is displayed.

Preparatory dialling

 Enter the number first. If you make a mistake as you dial, select Clear to delete the last digit. Press to dial the number

End a call

 Press or place the handset back on the base face down.

Receiving calls

Providing you have subscribed to your network's Caller Display service, the caller's number (or name if stored in the directory) is displayed. See *page 34*.

 Press or if the handset is on the base, simply lift it up and speak.

Earpiece volume

During a call you can adjust the volume of your caller's voice in the earpiece.

1. During a call, press ♠ or ♥ to increase or decrease the volume. The volume level is shown in the display, i.e. minimum = ▮ ▮ ▮ , maximum = ▮ ▮ ▮ ▮ ▮ .

Amplify your caller's voice

In addition to the earpiece volume settings, during a call you can amplify the incoming caller's voice.

- During a call, press , on the side of the handset. The display shows Amplify On for a few seconds and boosts the volume of the incoming caller's voice.
- 2. Press again to switch amplification off and display shows Amplify Off for a few seconds.

Secrecy

During a call, you can talk to someone nearby without your caller hearing.

- 1. During a call, select **Secrecy**. The display shows Secrecy and flashes. Your caller cannot hear you.
- 2. Select Off to return to your caller.

The new earpiece volume level remains set until changed again.

Amplification is switched off automatically at the end of the call.

With amplification on, the earpiece volume can still be increased or decreased accordingly.

Switch to handsfree during a call

Handsfree lets you talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to your conversation over the loudspeaker.

During a call:

1. Press and release until the call is transferred to the loudspeaker. The display shows the icon.

Press and release again if you want to switch from handsfree back to the handset.

2. Press **a** to end the call.

Keypad lock

Lock the keypad to prevent any accidental button presses or dialling of numbers. You can still answer calls while the keypad is locked; the keypad will remain unlocked for the duration of the call.

- 1. Press and hold to lock the keypad. The display shows Keypad Locked for a few seconds and the ? icon.
- 2. To unlock the keypad select **Unlock**, then press **(**

IMPORTANT

Emergency calls cannot be made while the keypad is locked. You will need to unlock the keypad before you can dial out.

Making and receiving calls at the base

Make an external call

Press . You will hear the dial tone over the loudspeaker.
 Dial the number.

Preparatory dialling

1. Enter the number. If you make a mistake press **Clear** to delete. Press to dial.

Dial from the directory

- Press ♠, scroll ♠ or ▼ through the list of names and numbers.
- 2. Press to call the number or **Back** to cancel.

Adjust loudspeaker volume

There are five levels to choose from.

1. During a call, press • or • to increase or decrease the volume.

The call timer is displayed on screen, starting a few seconds after the last digit is dialled.

When a handset is being used to make a call, the base display shows Call in progress, instead of the time and date.

End a call

1. Press 🔗.

Receiving calls

When the phone rings:

1. Press **3**. The call is taken via the loudspeaker.

Secrecy

Talk to someone else nearby without your caller hearing.

- During a call, press Secrecy. The display flashes Secrecy. Your caller cannot hear you.
- 2. Press Off to return to your caller.

Intercom

Press on the base. All registered handsets will ring.
 The first handset to press will take the call and this will start an internal call between the base and the handset.

Redial from the handset

The last 20 phone numbers you have dialled are saved to the redial list. You can select any of the numbers to redial, delete or copy to the directory. Once the list is full and a new call is made, the oldest call is replaced.

Redial a number from the redial list

- 1. Press the redial button ato enter the redial list. The most recently dialled number is displayed.
- 2. Use to scroll through the list until the number you want to redial is displayed. Once in the list you can scroll using a or .
- 3. Press to redial the number.

Save a number from the redial list to the directory

- 1. Press ♠. Then scroll ♥ to the number you want to save. (Once in the list you can scroll using ♠ or ♥).
- 2. Select Options. Save Number is displayed. Select OK.
- Enter Name is displayed. Enter a name using the keypad. Then select Save.
- 4. The display shows Entry Saved then returns to the first entry in the redial list.
- 5. Press 🝙 to exit.

If a call is made to a number already in the list, the previous occurrence will be deleted.

If a call is made to a number which is stored in the directory, the name will be displayed instead, see 'Directory', on page 24.

See 'Entering names' on *page 25* for help entering names in the directory.

If you make a mistake, select **Clear** to delete the last character.

If the memory is full you will not know until you press **Save**.

If the name is displayed you have to press Options twice.

Delete a number from the redial list

- Press ♠. Then scroll ♠ or ♥ to the number you want to delete.
- 2. Select **Options** and scroll **t** to Delete Call. Select **OK**. The display shows Call Deleted and returns to the newest call in the redial list.
- 3. Press 📤 to exit.

Delete all numbers from the redial list

- Press then select Options and scroll to Delete All Calls. Select OK.
- 2. The phone emits a confirmation tone and the display shows Empty, then returns to standby.

Redial from the base

Redial the last 10 numbers called from the base.

- Press Redial . The most recently dialled number is displayed.
- 2. Scroll △ or ▼ through the list. Press ⑤ to dial.

Save a redial number to the base directory

- 1. Press Redial. The most recently dialled number is displayed.
- 2. Scroll △ or ▼ to the number you want.
- 3. Press Options. Save number is displayed. Press OK.
- Enter the name and press Save to store the number. Display shows Entry Saved and then returns to the newest call in the redial list.
- 5. Press Pto exit.

Delete a number from the base redial list

- 1. Press Redia. The most recently dialled number is displayed.
- 2. Scroll **v** to the number you want.
- Press Options and scroll △ or ▼ to Delete Call.
 Press OK. Display shows Call Deleted and returns to the newest call in the redial list.
- 4. Press Pto exit.

Delete all numbers from the base redial list

- 1. Press Redial.
- Press Options and scroll ▼ to Delete All Calls. Press
 OK. Display shows Empty and then returns to standby.

If an entry in the redial list is also in the directory the name will be displayed instead of the number.

Selecting **Options** for such an entry will then display the number, and **Options** must be selected again to be able to save or delete.

If necessary, press Clear to edit

Using the directory

You can copy entries to the handset from another handset or from the base but you cannot copy entries from the handset to the base. Therefore, you may wish to enter entries in the base first and then copy them to the handset to save time, see page 33.

Directory full

If the directory is full when you try to add or copy an entry, the display will show Directory Full.

If you make a mistake, select ${\tt Clear}$ to delete digits.

Handset directory

You can store up to 100 entries in the handset directory. Each entry contains a name and number. Names can be up to 12 characters long and numbers up to 20 digits.

Add a new directory entry

- 1. From standby, select **Dir** to open the directory. If the directory is empty, Enter Name is displayed.
 - If there are already entries stored the first entry is shown. Select **Options**, New Entry is displayed. Select **OK**.
- Enter Name is displayed. Enter a name using the keypad.
 Then select Save. See the following page for help on how to enter names in the directory.
- Enter Number is displayed. Enter the telephone number.
 If you subscribe to your network's Caller Display service and want names in your directory displayed instead of the phone numbers, you must store the full telephone number including the area code.
- Select Save. The displays shows Entry Saved, then the new added entry.
- Add more entries using the above sequence or press to exit.

Entering names

To enter names, you use the letters on the keypad.

For example, press **3** for the letter T, or **6** *three times* for the letter D. See the character map below.

If the next character you want to enter is on the same button as the last, wait a moment for the cursor to move right.

To change between UPPER and lower case

To change between upper and lower case, press the button.

The 🛕 icon is displayed when upper case is selected. Characters will remain in upper or lower case until changed again.

Even if lower case is selected, the first letter of every word will be displayed as a capital letter.

To insert a space

Press 1 to insert a space.

To delete characters

If you make a mistake, select **Clear** to delete characters.

View and dial a directory entry

- Select Dir to open the directory. The first directory entry is displayed.
- 2. Use (a) and (b) to scroll alphabetically through the directory and find the entry you want to dial.
- 3. Press to dial the displayed entry.

If you wish, you can see the telephone number. Select Options, scroll ♥ to Sho⋈ Number and select OK.

Edit an entry

- Select Dir to open the directory and scroll or in quick-search, to the entry you want to edit.
- Select Options, then scroll ♠ or ♥ to Edit Entry and select OK.
- Select Clear to delete any incorrect name characters, then enter new ones and select Save when you have finished. The telephone number is displayed.
- 4. Select **Clear** to delete any incorrect telephone number digits, then enter new ones and select **Save** to confirm. The display shows Entry Saved then shows the edited entry.
- 5. Press 📤 to exit.

Quick-search a name

Press the keypad button with the first letter of the name you want. For example, press **7** three times to search for names beginning with R.

Delete an entry

- 1. Select **Dir** to open the directory and scroll **a** or **v**, or quick-search, to the entry you want to delete.
- Select Options, then scroll or to Delete Entry and select OK.
- The displays shows Delete Entry?. Select Yes to confirm the deletion (or No to go back). The display shows Deleted and returns to the directory.
- 4. Press 🖒 to exit and return to standby.

Assign a ringer melody to a directory entry

You can assign a different ringer melody to selected entries in your directory, for example, family members or friends. When one of these people call, you will be able to identify them from the different ringer melody.

- 1. Select **Dir** and scroll **a** or **v**, or quick-search, to the entry you want to assign a melody.
- Select Options, then scroll or ♥ to Set Melody and select OK. The current setting is displayed and will be played (unless set to 'off').

Please note this feature is only available if you have subscribed to a Caller Display Service.

- Scroll or to hear the choice available ("Off" and melodies 1-10). When you have chosen one, select OK. The display shows Saved and returns to set melody.
- 4. Press 🔁 to exit.

Copy a directory entry to another handset

If you have more than one handset registered to your Freestyle 6300 base you can copy entries, or the entire directory, between handsets.

- 1. Select **Dir** to open the directory and scroll **a** or **v**, or quick-search, to the entry you want to copy.
- 2. Select Options, then scroll ♠ or ♥ to Copy Entry and select OK
- 3. Scroll ♠ or ♥ to choose the handset to copy the entry to and select OK. The displays shows Copying to Handset x, during the transfer.
- 4. The receiving handset briefly shows Copying from Handset X (where X is the handset number that the copied entries are coming from). Once an entry has been successfully copied it shows the name of the entry for a few seconds. The display then returns to standby when the entry has been copied.

If the copy is refused or cannot be completed, the display will show Copy Failed.

If the directory entry is amended and then copied to another handset it does not overwrite the target phone's entry but creates an additional entry.

When you copy the entire directory to another handset it will add to the entries already stored.

IMPORTANT

If you are trying to copy more entries into the list than there is space for (maximum 100 entries) then the directory entries to be copied will *replace* the existing entries on the destination handset.

5. At the first handset, choose another handset to copy the entry to or press to exit.

Copy the entire directory to another handset

- Select Dir and the first name in the directory is displayed. Select Options then scroll to Copy All and select OK.
- 2. Scroll ♠ or ♥ to choose the handset to copy the directory to and select OK. The displays shows Copying to Handset x, during the transfer.
- 3. The receiving handset briefly shows Copying from Handset X (where X is the handset number that the copied entries are coming from). Once an entry has been successfully copied it shows the name of the entry for a few seconds. The display then returns to standby when the directory has been copied.
- 4. At the first handset, choose another handset to copy the directory to or press (a) to exit.

Base directory

You can store up to 100 name and number entries in the base. Names can be up to 12 characters and numbers up to 20 digits.

Add a new directory entry via the base

1. Press , then follow the steps shown for the handset on *page 24*. Please note that the base has a different character map from the handset.

View and dial a base directory entry

- 2. Press to dial.

Delete an entry

- 1. Press \bigcirc then scroll \triangle or \bigcirc to the entry you want.
- 3. Press **Yes** to confirm. Display shows Deleted, then returns to the first entry in the directory.
- 4. Press To return to standby.

Assign a ringer melody

- 1. Press \bigcirc then scroll \triangle or \bigcirc to the entry you want.
- Press Options and scroll or to Set Melody. Press OK.
- Scroll △ or ▼ to hear the choice available (Off and melodies 1-5).
- 4. Press **OK** to select the current melody.
- 5. Press To return to standby.

Copy a base directory entry to a handset

- 1. Press \bigcirc then scroll \triangle or \bigcirc to the entry you want.
- Press Options and scroll or to Copy Entry. Press OK.
- 3. Scroll △ or ▼ to select the handset and press OK.
- 4. The receiving handset shows Copying from Base.

Copy entire base directory to a handset

- 1. Press 🕮 .
- Press Options and scroll o or ▼ to Copy All. Press OK.
- 3. Scroll \triangle or ∇ to select the handset and press **OK**.
- 4. The receiving handset shows Copying from Base.

IMPORTANT

If you are trying to copy more entries into the directory than there is space for (maximum 100), the directory entries being copied will replace the existing entries on the handset.

You cannot copy directory entries from a handset to the base.
You can only copy from base to handset.

BT Calling Features & the Calls list

IMPORTANT

To use Caller Display you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A quarterly fee is payable. (Although a quarterly fee is payable with BT as the network provider, other providers may bill differently).

For more information, call BT free on 0800 800 150.

It may take a couple of seconds for the display to show the telephone number or name for an incoming call. The display will initially display External Call followed by the number.

Caller information not available

For some incoming calls, the telephone number of the caller is not available and so cannot be displayed.

In this case some explanatory information will be displayed.

Withheld

The number has been withheld or is unavailable.

Operator
The call has been made via the operator.

Ringback call.

Caller Display

If you have subscribed to a Caller Display service, your caller's number will be shown on your handset display (provided it is not withheld) prior to answering the call.

If the caller's number matches an entry stored in the directory, the name will be displayed instead.

Calls list

The Calls list stores details of the last 30 calls in the order they were received. The caller's details are stored in the Calls list whether you answered the call or not. If a call is received when the list is full, the oldest entry will be deleted automatically.

When you have received new calls the a icon will be displayed (flashing on the standby screen). When a new call is received on the Call list, the icon will flash on the display (in standby mode). 'New calls' are entries in the calls list that have not yet been viewed.

To stop the **a** icon flashing, you need to view all the new calls.

Accessing the Calls list from the Handset

View and dial an entry in the Calls list using the handset

- 1. Press ♥ to open the Calls list. The most recently received call is displayed. New will be displayed on the title bar when a call is new (i.e. has not yet been viewed).
- Use and to view other entries in the list.
 To see the date and time of the call, select Options.
 The date and time of the call will be displayed.
 Select Back to return to the entry.
- 3. Press to dial the displayed entry.

 The number will be dialled automatically.

Or, press to exit the Calls list.

When all new calls in the list have been viewed, the account on the standby screen will disappear.

Save a Calls list entry to the directory using the handset

1. Press ♥ to open the Calls list. Then scroll ♠ or ♥ to the entry you want to save.

If the name is displayed you have to press Options twice.

See 'Entering names' on *page 25* for help entering names in the directory.

If you make a mistake, select **Clear** to delete the last character/s.

- Select Options. The date and time of the call is displayed. Select Options again and then scroll to Save Number and select OK.
- Enter Name is displayed. Enter a name using the keypad.
 Then select Save.
- 4. The display shows Entry Saved. Press 🗲 to exit.

Delete a Calls list entry using the handset

- Select Options again and scroll to Delete Call.
 Select OK. The handset gives a confirmation tone as the call is deleted and the display returns to the most recent entry in the list.
- 4. Press 🔁 to exit.

Delete all numbers from the Calls list using the handset

- Press , then select Options. The display shows the time and date of the most recent call (or the telephone number if it had been displayed as a directory name, in which case select Options again).
- Select Options again and scroll to Delete All Calls.
 Select OK. The handset gives a confirmation tone and the display briefly shows Empty before returning to standby.

If the name is displayed, you need to select **Options** again.

Accessing the Calls list from the Base

View and dial an entry in the base Calls list

- 1. Press to open the calls list. The number (or name if stored in the base directory) is displayed. Press **Options** to view the date and time of the call.
- 2. Scroll △ or ▼ through the list. New on the title bar indicates unviewed calls.
- 3. Press \mathfrak{D} to dial the number or \mathfrak{S} to exit the list.

When all new calls have been viewed, the flashing icon on the screen will disappear.

Delete entire calls list

- 1. Press to open the calls list.
- Press Options twice then scroll ▼ to Delete All and press OK. The display briefly shows Empty before returning to standby.

Call Waiting

With Call Waiting, during a call, if another caller is trying to reach you, you will hear a soft beep every 5 seconds.

If you have also subscribed to a Caller Display service, the caller's number (or name if stored in the directory) will be displayed.

Instead of the engaged tone, the second caller will hear an announcement asking them to hold the line.

To use Call Waiting

To answer the second call, without disconnecting from your first caller:

- Press . The first caller will be put on hold and you will be connected to the second caller.
- Press again to return to the first caller, and then press it each time you want to switch between the two callers.

To disconnect the first call:

- 1. Press to end the first call. The handset will then ring.
- Press and continue your conversation with the second caller.

Call Waiting works in the same way for the base as it does for the handset.

Auto talk

When the handset it on the base, you can answer a call just by picking it up. When auto talk is switched off, you will have to press to answer a call.

- 1. Select Menu, the display shows Set Handset. Select OK.

- Use ♠ or ♥ to choose On or Off, then select OK.
 The display shows Saved.
- 4. Press 📤 to exit.

The default key beeps setting is On

The default Auto Talk setting is On.

Time & date auto-set

If you subscribe to your network's Caller Display service, the date and time are set automatically when your BT Freestyle 6300 receives its first call.

The time is always set in 24-hour clock, regardless of the time format setting.

The default time format is 24-hour. However, you can use the 12-hour clock if you wish.

Handset language

You can change the language shown on the display.

- 1. Select Menu, the display shows Set Handset, select OK.

Additional handsets & bases

You can use up to four additional handsets with your BT Freestyle 6300 – all using the same phone line. This allows you to expand your phone system without the need to install telephone extension sockets for each new handset.

Your BT Freestyle 6300 handset can also be registered with up to 4 DECT compatible bases. You can then select the base you would prefer to use.

Each additional handset is supplied with its own charger and user guide, but the following information will tell you how to register and use an additional handset with your BT Freestyle 6300.

IMPORTANT

Before registration, make sure the handset batteries are fully charged and that you are close to the base.

Register a handset to a base

- 1. At the handset: Select Menu, scroll or to Registration and select OK.
- 2. The display shows Register H/S. Select OK.
- The display shows Base 1 2 3 4. Enter the base number you want to register the handset to, using the keypad.
- The display shows PIN?. Enter your system PIN (default: 0000), then select OK.
- 5. At the base you want to register to, press and hold for approximately 5 seconds until you hear a confirmation beep, then release . The handset display will show Search X (X being the number of the base selected). The base display will show Registration.

The handset will be automatically assigned the next available handset number, which is shown in the display.

Select a base

If your BT Freestyle 6300 handset is registered to more than one base, you can select which base to use.

- At the handset, select Menu, scroll to Registration and select OK.
- 2. Scroll or to Select Base and select OK. The base that your handset is currently connected to is displayed.
- 3. Scroll ♠ or ♥ . All the bases that the handset is registered to are marked with a # symbol. Once you have chosen a base, select OK.
- 4. The display shows Registered To Base X (where X is the base number the handset is registered to).

De-register a handset

You cannot de-register the handset you are using. To de-register this handset, another registered handset must be used.

As you cannot de-register the handset you are using it will not include its own number when in de-registration mode.

Make an internal call handset to handset only

If you have two or more handsets registered to your base, you can make internal calls between handsets.

Two handsets can be holding an internal call while a third is on an external call.

- Press . The display shows Handset: then enter the handset number you want to call (e.g. 1-5).
- 2. The receiving handset displays the number of the handset calling, eg. Handset: 1. Press to answer the internal call or remove the handset from the base.
- 3. Press on either handset to end the call.

Make an internal call from the base to another handset

- Press on the base. All registered handsets will ring and display Call. The first handset to press will take the call.
- 2. Press on either handset or base to end the call.

Transferring calls

You can transfer an external call to another handset registered to the base.

During your call:

- Press . Your external caller is put on hold and the display shows Handset: then enter the handset number you want to call (e.g. 1-5).
- 2. When the receiving handset answers, press the to transfer the call. Your handset returns to standby. If the receiving handset does not answer, press to return to the external call

3-Way conference call (from the handsets only)

During an external call you can invite another handset to join the conversation.

During your call:

- 1. Press . Your external caller is put on hold. The display shows Handset: then enter the handset number you want to call (e.g. 1–5).
- When the receiving handset answers, press and hold the for approximately 2 seconds to begin the conference call.
- Press on either handset to leave the conference call.
 The second handset will remain connected to the external caller.

The Cicon flashes to indicate your external caller is on hold.

Switch between external and internal calls

When the receiving handset answers, you can press **b** to switch between the external and internal calls, before transferring.

3-way conference call (from the base only)

- 1. Press on the base. All registered handsets will ring.
- 2. Press on the handset that you wish to use for the conference call.
- Conf. is then displayed on the left hand side option button base display. Press Conf and the conference call will begin.
- 4 Press on either handset or base to leave the conference call. The remaining handset or base will remain connected to the external caller.

Help

Many common problems are caused by the telephone and power cables being incorrectly connected, not connected at all, or the power being turned off.

Please check that your BT Freestyle 6300 has been correctly set up, see page 6, before ringing the BT Freestyle Helpline.

Replacing the handset batteries

After time, you may find that the handset batteries are running out of charge more quickly. This is a standard sign of wear and the batteries will need replacing. New batteries should be AAA size, Rechargeable Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH), capacity 550mAh.

- 1. Press down on the top of the battery compartment cover and slide it off. See illustration on page 7.
- 2. Remove the old batteries and replace with 2 new ones, then replace the battery compartment cover.

No display

The batteries may be flat, dead or incorrectly inserted.

Buzzing noise on my phone or on other electrical equipment nearby
