
Getting started

Place your BT Freestyle 650 close enough to a mains power and telephone socket so that the cables will reach.

The handset range is up to 300 metres outdoors and 50 metres indoors (in ideal conditions). The 1) icon indicates when you are in range, it flashes when you go out of range. Try to position the phone at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference and help maximise the handset range.

Setting up

- 1. Plug the power adaptor and telephone cable into the back of the base. Only use the cables provided with the product.
- 2. Plug the power adaptor into the mains power wall socket and switch the power on. The green Power light and the red Messages light on the base will come on and the answering machine outgoing message will be announced.



- 3. Place the battery ribbon in the base of the handset battery compartment and insert the two batteries supplied observing the polarity markings. Then slide the battery compartment cover into place.
- 4. Place the handset on the base to charge, the red Charging indicator will light up and you will hear a beep. In the handset display you will see an animated which shows the handset is charging. Charge the handset for at least 24 hours before first use.
- 5. Once fully charged, plug the telephone line cord into the telephone wall socket.

Set up your additional handsets (2, 3 and 4-Pack owners only)

- 1. For each additional handset, plug the power adaptor into the back of the charger and plug the other end into the mains wall socket and switch the power on.
- 2. Insert the batteries into the handset, as detailed in point 3 above, and place the handset on the charger. The red Charging indicator will light up and the animated ricon will be displayed. Charge the handset for at least 24 hours before first use. Each handset will display its handset number: 1, 2, 3 and so on.

Set the day and time using the handset

When you listen to your messages or memos, the date and time of the recording is announced, so before you receive your first message or memo you need to set the correct date and time.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll v to TAM SETTINGS and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll v to DRY SETTING and press . The current day is displayed.
- 3. Use ∇ and \triangle to select the required day and press \wedge to confirm.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to DRTE-TIME and press Menu.
- 2. Scroll **v** to *CLOCK SET* and press **Merv**. The current time is displayed.
- 3. Use the keypad to enter the correct time in 24-hour format, eg. 1830 for 6.30pm. Press Menu to confirm.

Navigating the menus


Your BT Freestyle 650 has an easy menu system through which you can access many of your phone's features and settings.

Press to go back to the previous menu, or keep pressing to return to the


Menu map



Making and receiving calls

Make/end a call

1. Press , listen for the dialling tone, then dial the number. To end the call, press again, or replace the handset on the base or charger.



Preparatory dialling

- 1. Enter the number first. If you make a mistake, press to delete the last digit.
- 2. Press to dial.

Earpiece volume

During a call, you can use the **v** and **b** buttons to adjust the volume of the caller's voice in the earpiece. There are 5 volume levels – the default is level 3.

Receiving calls

When you receive a call, the base and handset will ring.

1. To answer the call press . Or if the handset is on the base or charger, simply lift it to answer the call.

Handset ringer volume

When the phone is ringing, you can use the vand buttons to adjust the handset ringer volume. There are 5 volume levels, or you can switch the ringer off.

Handsfree

1. Press the u button on the side of the handset, listen for the dial tone then dial the number. When handsfree is on, the **■** icon is displayed.

At any time during the call, press of to switch between handsfree and the handset.

Special features

Your BT Freestyle 650 has some special features including a 30 number phonebook, an answering machine and a calls list.

Phonebook

You can store up to 30 of your most frequently used names and numbers in the phonebook to make dialling quick and easy.

Add a new phonebook entry

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to PHONEBOOK and press Menu.
- 2. The display shows RDD ENTRY. Press Menu
- 3. NAME? is displayed. Enter a name using the keypad, then press Menu.
- 4. NUMBER? is displayed. Enter the telephone number, then press
- 5. Select a ringer melody (1 to 10) using ∇ and \bigcirc , then press \bigcirc . You will hear a confirmation beep.
- 6. Press secrecy repeatedly to return to standby.

Dial a phonebook entry

- 1. Press . Entries are displayed alphabetically.
- 2. Enter the first letter of the name you want using the keypad, then scroll to the exact entry using **v** and **a**. Press **b** to dial the number.



Answering machine

After following the 'Getting started' section, your BT Freestyle 650 answering machine will be set to **Answer on** and is ready to start receiving messages. Press to switch the answering machine on and off.

You can select one of the pre-recorded outgoing messages – answer & record or answer only or you can record your own personalised outgoing message. Press 🗞 to hear your current outgoing message.

You can also record memo messages for other users, screen calls and you can operate the answering machine remotely. For detailed instructions of all the answering machine features see the online user guide at www.bt.com/help/userguides

Listening to your messages/memos

When you have messages recorded on your answering machine, the Messages light on the base will flash.

At the base, press Play to hear any **new** messages, or **press and hold** Play to hear all messages. The oldest message is played first.

During playback, press:

or to adjust the loudspeaker volume.

to pause/resume playback.



once to repeat the current message, twice to play the previous message.



to skip to the next message.



to mark the message for deletion, you will hear "Message deleted".



to stop playback.

At the end of playback, you can press:



to delete all messages; or

to cancel message deletion and restore any messages you have marked for deletion. Any messages not deleted are saved.

Caller Display and the calls list

You must subscribe to a Caller Display service for this feature to work. Your network provider may charge you for this service.

Caller Display allows you to see who is calling you before you answer the phone. The calls list holds details of your last 40 callers, including the phone number, date and time of the call. If a number matches a stored phonebook entry, the caller's name and number will be shown alternately in the display.

The calls list also alerts you to missed calls – the a icon will flash in the display.


To access and dial from the calls list

1. Press ∇ to open the calls list. Use ∇ and \triangle to scroll through the entries.





2. To exit the calls list, press Secret

Troubleshooting

Most problems are caused by something very simple and can be fixed with a few simple checks:

- Make sure both the mains power adaptor cable and telephone line cord are plugged into the correct sockets and plugged in at the wall.
- Make sure you use all the cables and batteries (if supplied) that came in the box, not those from a previous product.
- If you experience poor speech quality or interference, make sure the product is not located too close to other electrical appliances. This can also help improve the handset range from the base.
- Make sure you charge the batteries for at least 24 hours before first use to ensure maximum battery performance. The charge capacity of the batteries will decrease

Remember to plug the phone into the wall socket via an ADSL microfilter if you have broadband Internet on your phone line, otherwise you may have problems with this product and your broadband service. Additional BT ADSL microfilters can be purchased from www.shop.bt.com


